 - On both levels, to provide a platform for knowledge and technology transfer and cooperation

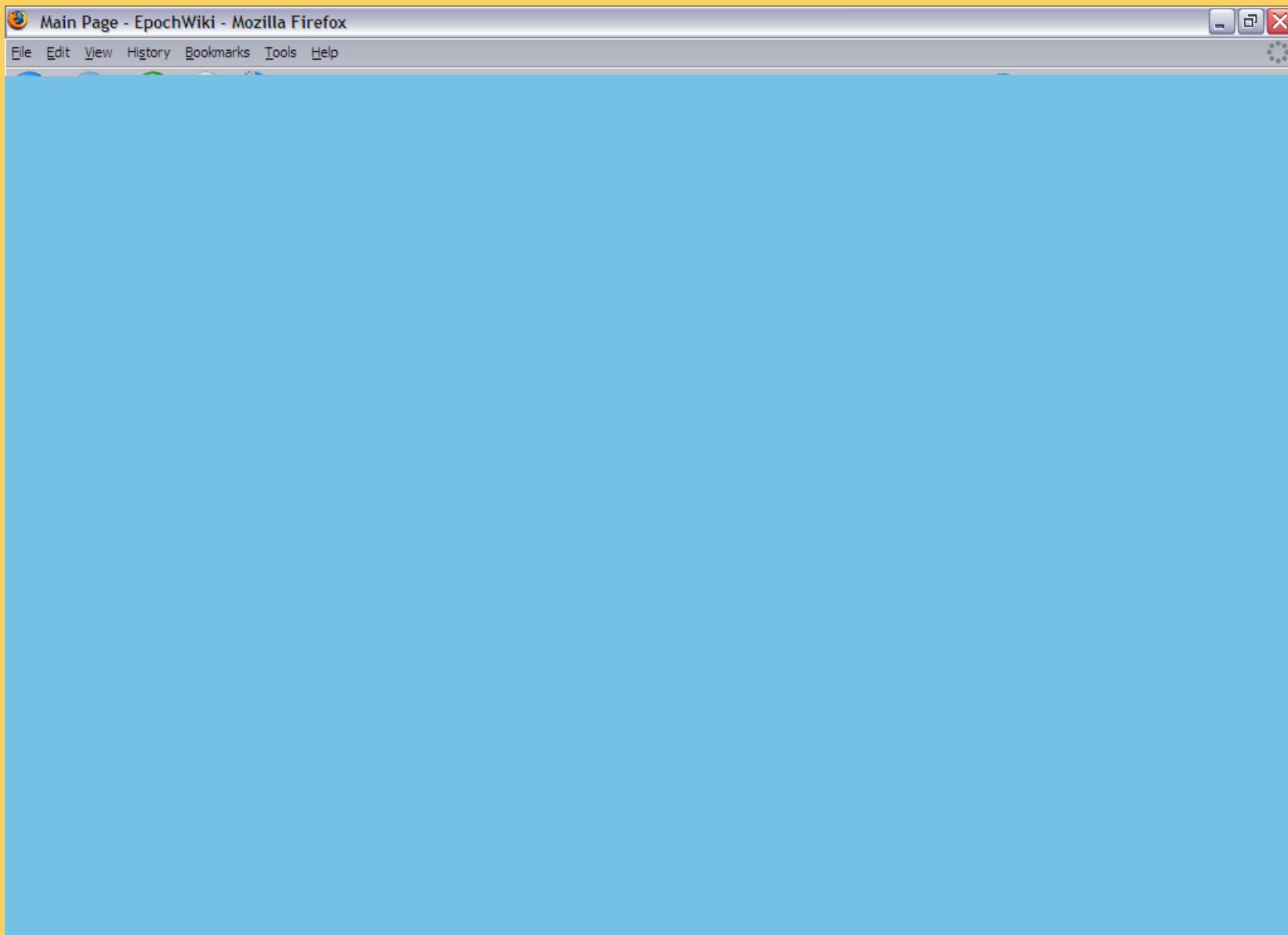
- Will continue the Network of Expertise effort in EPOCH

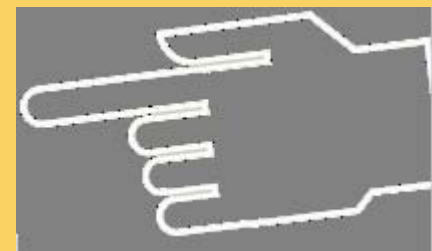
